

# Puma REST samples

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## Introduction

This article holds a collection of PUMA (Portal User Management Architecture) REST API usage samples and is written to give a jump-start into development using the PUMA REST services. Each use case will be summarized with URL, in- and output data. The article does neither cover general development for REST services nor all details of PUMA REST API. It has been written using IBM WebSphere Portal 7.0.0.2. Note that in other releases details may change and other uses cases may be supported. Also there is no warranty, for official documentation see the latest product documentation.

The Puma REST API should be used in code that is running outside the portal context, e.g. in a remote client. If your code is running inside portal context, you should use the standard Puma API instead, e.g. in a portlet.

Return Codes to be expected are according to other REST APIs. Most common are:

- HTTP 200: OK
- HTTP 201: Created
- HTTP 400: Bad Request (verify URL, URL parameters and input data)
- HTTP 401: Unauthorized (need to login)
- HTTP 403: Forbidden (see output)
- HTTP 404: Resource not found (verify URL)

For other return codes see the official product documentation.

### **URLs to be used**

The PUMA REST API can be accessed with two different URL formats:

- **/wps/um/secure/currentuser/profile**
- **/wps/mycontenthandler?uri=um:secure/currentuser/profile**

In this document we will use the first format as links within the payload of responses consistently use that format as well. If you prefer the second format, which is equivalent, be sure that you have installed at least IBM WebSphere Portal 7.0.0.1 CF009 or 7.0.0.2.

### **Authentication**

The Remote PUMA SPI REST Service allows requests to some operations only for authenticated users. If you plan to use the HTTP basic authentication with the URL pattern “/um/secure”, you need to configure the corresponding Trust Association Interceptor (TAI) in IBM WebSphere Application Server (WAS).

## Parameters

### ***expandRefs***

Whenever there are references included in the REST responses, they are by default included without details. This is done because the URL parameter “expandRefs” is “false” by default. If you add the parameter to your REST call using “true” then all references (e.g. users in a search request) will contain details. One example is that in a search request for all users the user's attribute values are included in the response as well. Another example is that for group membership request the group details are included in the response as well. See examples in the section “Working with membership”.

### ***resultsPerPage***

You can add this parameter to URLs if you want to page through the result. The response will contain information about total number of search results and links to first, last and next page.

### ***sortByAttributes***

If you use resultsPerPage then you can add this parameter to determine the attribute that is used for sorting the result list.

### ***sortDescending***

If you use sortByAttributes then you can add this parameter to invert the sort order from ascending to descending.

### ***update***

This parameter is to be used for update requests. It defines how the update will be done. Possible values are:

- replace: All existing data relevant to this update will be replaced by the input. This is the default.
- merge: The existing data relevant to this update and input data will be merged.
- delete: The existing attributes or instances relevant to this update (depending on the area where used), that are also in the input data will be deleted. Values of the input data are ignored here.

## Retrieving the current user

You can retrieve the current user which is the user that sends the request. To send a request to the PUMA REST URL containing “secure” you need to be authenticated (logged in). If you are not, you will receive HTTP 401.

There is one special use case that does not need you to be authenticated. You can send the same request to the non-secured PUMA REST URL with authenticating first. In this case you will receive the values for the “anonymous portal user”.

GET <http://portalhost:10039/wps/um/currentuser/profile>

Result: HTTP 200

We do not give an example output here, as it holds all available attributes, but the only having values are attributes “identifier” and “uid” in our setup.

## Working with users

### Search

Get all users:

You can retrieve all available users as configured to PUMA and Virtual User Manager (VMM). Note that this call might return a huge list of users according to your setup. In that case you may want to page the result using URL parameter "resultsPerPage".

## Get some users in a sorted and paged view

If you want to search for one or more users, you can use the URL parameter “searchAttributes” to name attributes and the search pattern for them. The “=” needs also to be URL encoded and becomes “%3d”. For attribute value you can work with asterisk “\*”, which needs to be entered URL encoded as “%2A”.

You can use “resultsPerPage” attribute to specify how many results should be returned per request. Use “sortByAttribute” to specify the attribute that is used for sorting the result list and “descending” to specify the sort order.

You need to add any attributes you want to retrieve for the users in the result as URL parameter "includeAttributes". If you name a not existing attribute you will receive HTTP 400. E.g. for an attribute named "something" we receive: "Error 400: EJPSG0007E: One of the attributes specified is not defined for this member type.something"

## Retrieve

You can retrieve a single user's information by two different approaches:

### 1. GET using serialized ObjectID:

<http://portalHost:<portalPortNumber>/wps/um/secure/users/profiles/<ObjectID>>

e.g.:

<http://portalHost:<portalPortNumber>/wps/um/secure/users/profiles/9eAeJ9C6JQKCKHO6M86KPO4JMG6H9E6JM4CP1C0JM46JPOC6RK6G9O0JH1633>

### 2. GET using the DN:

<http://portalHost:<portalPortNumber>/wps/um/secure/users/profiles?identifier=<DN>>

e.g.:

<http://portalHost:<portalPortNumber>/wps/um/secure/users/profiles?identifier=uid=wpsadmin,o=defaultWIMFileBasedRealm>

Note that you get the full attribute list on retrieve using the serialized ObjectID. Instead when using the identifier you only get the basic entry for the user as it is handled as a search. You can then specify the attributes you want to receive as URL parameter. E.g. “&includeAttributes=uid,ibm-primaryEmail”

## ***Adding member to a group***

In this sample we add “user1” to the user group “VIP”. Before doing this we have looked up the serialized group ObjectID, which is:

“Z8eAe4JC86J57H9C2JMO66RD6MMG62BC8JM8CL1P4MMG6L1C23SO6PPDE3JDCK1”.

We need to send a request to the membership URL for “user1”. As we want to add the membership, we set the url parameter “update=merge” to keep all existing group membership for that user.

### ***Removing member from a group***

If we want to remove the user we send in the same payload as we would do for adding a member to a group. But we set the URL parameter “update=delete”. The member will be deleted from all groups which we identify in the payload data.

### **Working with attributes**

#### ***Retrieving attribute definitions***

The following samples show how to retrieve attribute definition for users or groups. In these examples we work only with user attributes but you can retrieve group attributes the same way by replacing the string “users” in the URLs with “groups”.

Note that you only retrieve attribute definitions – you cannot update, add or delete attributes.

You can use the “expandRefs” URL parameter to get the attribute definitions in the list of references returned in the response. If you do not want to get them automatically, you can retrieve the attribute definition for any attribute by calling the attribute's link included in the response yourself

A more complex example is to POST the content of attached file "Add4ImagesToUser.xml" to URL <http://portalhost:10039/wps/um/secure/currentuser/profile>. That file contains four small images in base64 encoded format (encoding has been done with JAVA class `org.eclipse.emf.ecore.xml.type.internal.DataValue.HexBin`). Thus those four images will be attached to the current user's profile will. Then load attached file `AddressProfileAttributeDirectly.html` in your browser and you should see something like this:
